Dear Parents/Carers

Behaviour management is a topic that has been raised at different times in recent years. This year, our school is embarking on a journey to clearly articulate our expected behaviours across the community.

From 2017, Curtin Primary is implementing a whole school program called Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL). This program is used across Australia and America and is based on research about behaviour management in schools that optimises student learning. Follow up research demonstrates that over time, PBL schools find increased academic results. PBL emphasises the opportunity to reduce the repeated minor interruptions that impact on teaching and learning time for schools. While the majority of students at Curtin generally display appropriate behaviours, we believe the program will support us to enhance our learning culture. PBL will complement our existing social and emotional literacy and wellbeing programs as well as the processes in place to deal with complex behaviours as they arise. The ACT Education Directorate is supporting PBL in public schools as one of the recommendations of the 2015 Schools for All Expert Panel Report. The PBL process involves several steps. The first few of these are:

- clearly stating whole school behaviour expectations
- designing rules for achieving the expectations across the school
- teaching the expected behaviour across the school
- developing a recognition system for positive behaviours.

Our teachers have worked through a process to develop our expectations, or values. These are:

- Be Safe
- Be Respectful
- Be a Learner

During the remainder of 2017, these will replace the 6Cs. The links between our expectations and the school vision will also be made clear to each student. This is very exciting as the role of students as learners is clearly articulated in our values.

To introduce the values to students, a design competition for our PBL mascots is being sent home with next week’s newsletter. The existing school mascot, Oats, will be the basis of the competition. With the support of our P&C, the mascot and values will be professionally printed for display around the school.

Next term, the expectations will be expanded into rules for the common areas of the school (eg corridors, canteen, toilets, bike cage and playground). Staff, students and parents will be able to contribute to articulating rules in these spaces. Once the rules are in place, we will develop our recognition system and opportunities to teach the rules in each space.

To keep you informed of the PBL process, the weekly newsletter will include a PBL update. This might be a school action, fact or point for consideration. We invite you to engage with the PBL process and value your questions or comments at any time. Please feel welcome to talk to a staff member at any time or to make contact by email. Our PBL leadership team includes representatives from across the school. The team includes Leslee Roberts (senior school), Christina Refshauge (LSU/C), Kate North (executive), Amanda Beresford (release), Merryn O’Dea (P-6 principal) and Leanne Harrigan (junior primary).

We look forward to the exciting changes PBL will bring during and beyond 2017.
