Reading and signing each child's report was a great privilege. As a principal, I was left so proud of our school and the learning progression evident for each child. This increase in skills and understandings for students as individuals is our core business as teachers. Behind the scenes, teachers are working to further analyse student assessments and plan tailored learning programs for term 3.

As a growing school, we have welcomed approximately 30 new students since February. To accommodate learning for all students, from term 3 we will be slightly rearranging our class structure. 6SL will be split into two groups and join 6HH and 6RD in the Patterson Hall. Jimi Connal has been invaluable to Curtin as an LSA and classroom teacher. Jimi has provided a supportive learning environment, collaborated with teachers in the shared space and led school programs. While we understand the lure of Melbourne and extended family, the 3/4 students and whole school community will miss Jimi's considered, calm and dedicated approach to improving learning.

Maryanne Hayes has made a huge impact to learning at Curtin as a temporary Deputy Principal. Maryanne's legacy includes our *Bring your own Chromebook* program, innovative approaches to reading instruction in kindergarten, and supportive preschool team. Maryanne has mentored teachers and students to achieve their best at Curtin. After an extension time in the school to embed our ICT approach, we farewell Maryanne and wish her well in return to Hughes Primary School.

Board Report - Meeting June 8th 2017

The new board, with a number of new members is learning the board processes and exploring the diversity of the board.

Discussion was mainly around the *Positive Behaviour for Learning* program and the results that are being achieved. This combines with the existing provisions for behaviour management that the school constantly works to improve. Results of reflections on 2016 and 2017 are positive as the incidence of playground incidents has reduced and other indicators are also very positive.

The ACT department of education is conducting a wide ranging review of education in the ACT. Historically the measures of education quality in the ACT were at the top of the measures for all states and territories. While our results are still above average overall, they have come back to be less outstanding than they were in the past. The department is now consulting widely on ideas that may be considered to further enhance education at all levels in the ACT. All suggestions are welcome and it is expected that this will result in a number of initiatives that will be rolled out once they have been fully developed.

The board will now set a full set of agenda topics for future discussion, along with a timetable for future meetings. These will support the school's strategic plan and areas for development identified in school data. If there are any areas that parents feel should be considered, please let me or any other member of the board know of your suggestions.

The board passed the existing finance reports.

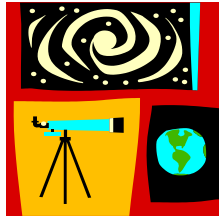
In the middle session, Phil their part time photography teacher and part time magician, put on an AMAZING MAGIC SHOW!

Our next task was to create a negative image using pinhole cameras.

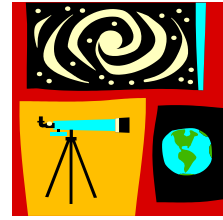
Finally, we converted our negative images into positive images. We had an AMAZING time learning about photographic techniques!
